The British Empire is a term used to describe all the places around the world that were once ruled by Britain.


Key Facts:

- British Empire was between 1600 1997.
- Over ¼ the world's population & the world's area.
- The years 1815 to 1914 are referred to as Britain's imperial century.
- Some of the colonies of the British Empire were:
 Canada, Australia, New Zealand, India, Egypt, Kenya.
- The East India Company controlled over half the world's trade.
- Trading of spices, gold, coffee, cotton, sugar brought great wealth to the Empire.

Term	Explanation
Legacy	Something that is handed down from one period of time to another period of time.
Industrial Revolution 1760- 1840	The Industrial Revolution was a time when manufacturing of goods moved from small shops/homes to large factories.
America War of Independence	1775– 1783 The British were defeated and recognised USA as an independent country.
Slavery Abolition Act 1833	This called for the immediate abolishment (end) of slavery in most parts of the British Empire.
Empire	An 'empire' is a group of countries ruled over by a single monarch or ruling power.
Colonies	A country under the full or partial political control of another country and occupied by settlers from that country
