



Remote Education Provision

This information is intended to provide clarity and transparency to pupils and parents or carers about what to expect from remote education if local restrictions require entire cohorts (or bubbles) to remain at home. It also explains procedures followed during a national lockdown with a partial closure of schools.

The curriculum will vary from the normal timetable that would be taught in school. Home learning will on average be 4 hours a day in KS2 and 3 hours in KS1.

We use a combination of the following approaches to teach pupils remotely:

- live teaching (online lessons in groups usually of up to 15; these are groups of 10 in Foundation Stage)
- recorded teaching (e.g. Oak National Academy lessons, video/audio recordings made by teachers)
- printed work packs produced by teachers (e.g. workbooks, worksheets)
- textbooks and reading books pupils have at home
- commercially available websites supporting the teaching of specific subjects or areas, including video clips or sequences
- long-term project work and/or internet research activities

Feedback will take many forms. Our approach to feeding back on pupil work is as follows:

- answers are provided in workbooks and home learning packs
- instant feedback provided during online sessions
- online quizzes with automatic feedback
- opportunities to discuss misconceptions online with teachers

We recognise that some pupils may not have suitable online access at home. We take the following approaches to support those pupils to access remote education:

- provide a school laptop
- support for internet access
- phone calls home

<p>If a child is sent home with COVID-19 symptoms and is self-isolating for 10 days or have been in contact with someone with COVID-19 and is self-isolating for 10 days</p> <p><i>(If the child is poorly themselves, home learning will not be expected)</i></p>	<p>A 2-week learning pack is sent home when the school is informed of the child's absence or given to the child whilst they wait to be collected.</p>

Scenario	Home Learning
<p>If a class needs to self-isolate for up to 10 days</p> <p><i>(If the child is poorly themselves, home learning will not be expected)</i></p>	<p>Day 1 of self-isolation</p> <p>A pupil's first day of being educated remotely might look different from our standard approach, while we take all necessary actions to prepare for a longer period of remote teaching.</p> <p>A timetable will be sent home to ensure children can continue their learning immediately. The timetable will consist of the following activities:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Daily online English and maths lessons • Handwriting sessions • Spelling sessions • Multiplication or number facts rehearsal • Science/Geography/History tasks • Creative tasks (for example, art lessons) <p>Rainbow Room Group – Daily maths and English online sessions will continue for these pupils</p> <p>Parents can make contact with teachers via e-mail.</p>
